Return to School Information

- ◆ First day of school is Thursday, August 20th
- ◆ Families choose either in-person or virtual eLearning during [online registration](#)
- ◆ The deadline for selecting virtual eLearning is [August 6th](#)
- ◆ Both in-person and virtual eLearning options are held 5 days a week
- ◆ 7th & 8th Grade Orientations & Device deployment begin on August 10th. See schedule to the left. (More information to come)

In-Person Option

- ◆ Families will be able to select this option during [online registration](#). (should open on Monday, July 27th)
- ◆ Students may switch from in-person to eLearning during the first 10 days of school only. (1 time only)
- ◆ Students may switch from eLearning to in-person during the first 10 days of school, or at the end of a grading quarter, or at the end of the semester. (1 time only)
- ◆ **High Ability** students will have access to all TJHS offered HA courses.
- ◆ The following **High Ability** courses are offered for high school credit **with a weighted scale**.
 - ◆ English Honors 9 (Grade 8 Only)
 - ◆ Honors Biology (Grade 8 Only)
 - ◆ Honors Geometry (Grade 8 Only)
- ◆ The following **High Ability** courses are offered for high school credit **without a weighted scale**.
 - ◆ Algebra

Virtual eLearning Option

- ◆ Virtual eLearning will be delivered via Edmentum (PLATO) [Please click this link to learn more.](#)
- ◆ Families will be able to select this option during online registration. (should open on Monday, August 27th)
- ◆ Students may switch from in-person to eLearning during the first 10 days of school only. (1 time only).
- ◆ Students may switch from eLearning to in-person during the first 10 days of school, or at the end of a grading quarter, or at the semester. (1 time only)
- ◆ Standard 7th grade virtual courses include:
 - ◆ Math 07, English 07, Science 07, World History, Health, Photography, Fitness, Career Explorations
- ◆ Standard 8th grade virtual courses include:
 - ◆ Math 08, English 08, Science 08, US History, FACS, Engineering and Tech., Fitness, Essential Career Skills, & the second part of Spanish for students that completed the first part last year (Chinese is not offered virtually)
- ◆ The following classes will be offered to **High Ability** students through Edmentum. Please note that the classes listed below are a grade level advanced but are not true High Ability classes. These classes will be offered for high school credit **without a weighted scale**.
 - ◆ *Biology*
 - ◆ *Geometry*
 - ◆ *English 9*
 - ◆ *Algebra*
- ◆ **High Ability** families are encouraged to discuss the GPA ramifications of not having a weighted scale for Biology, Geometry, and English 9.
- ◆ The TJHS **High Ability** Coordinator is prepared to provide individual support. Mrs. Rosenberry can be reached at rosenberry@lsc.k12.in.us.
- ◆ For **Special Education** families that opt for Virtual eLearning it will be the duty of the Case Conference Committee to determine services, support, and accommodations.
- ◆ Students selecting the virtual option may still participate in **after school** extra and co-curricular activities. Students selecting the virtual option that have an interest in band may contact [Mr. Parthun](#) for resources. Transportation is not provided.

Social Distancing

- ◆ Additional physical distancing will be implemented where possible.
- ◆ All classroom desks have been spread out to maximum distance available in each classroom.
- ◆ Additional spaces (both outdoor & indoor) have been added to lunch.
- ◆ Breakfast will be eaten in the classroom.
- ◆ Students on AM buses will disembark in a staggered fashion.
- ◆ Stairwells have been made one way to encourage efficient flow and to reduce cross traffic.
- ◆ A staggered dismissal will be implemented to between 3:10 & 3:15.
- ◆ Passing period has been reduced from four to three minutes to discourage large congregations.
- ◆ Non-student visits will be reduced to essential functions only.
- ◆ Both PE and regular lockers will not be used.

Masks

- ◆ Students, staff, and visitors are required to wear masks at all times.
- ◆ Students engaged in vigorous physical activity in which appropriate social distancing can be achieved will not be required to wear a mask.
- ◆ Students eating at lunch or playing a musical instrument that requires their mouth to play will not be required to wear a mask.
- ◆ Individual students may request a short mask break during class to go in the hallway alone to adjust their mask.
- ◆ Students that are simply unwilling to wear a mask should select the virtual option.
- ◆ In some cases, there may be a medical reason that students, staff, or visitors cannot wear a mask.

COVID Positive Protocol

- ◆ Symptomatic (positive test with symptoms) may return if:
 - ◆ No longer has a fever for 72 hours without the use of fever reducing medications &
 - ◆ Other symptoms have improved &
 - ◆ At least 10 calendar days have passed since symptoms first appeared &
 - ◆ The individual has received two negative tests
- ◆ Asymptomatic (positive test without symptoms) may return if:
 - ◆ At least 10 calendar days have passed since symptoms first appeared &
 - ◆ Released by a healthcare provider

Handwashing & Sanitizing

- ◆ Students are expected to sanitize their hands during each passing period. Additional sanitize stations have been placed throughout the building.
- ◆ Students are expected to wash their hands throughout the day. Students will be required to wash their hands during the middle of their Lang. Arts block.
- ◆ Students will be encouraged to wash their hands prior to lunch.

Cleaning Protocols

- ◆ Additional cleaning and disinfecting products and procedures will be implemented.
- ◆ Shared desks, tables, and instructional supplies will be sanitized between each usage.

Training

- ◆ Formal COVID training will be provided to staff on August 19th.
- ◆ Ongoing COVID related information and procedures are shared with staff on an ongoing basis.
- ◆ Formal COVID training will be provided to students during device pick-up on the week of August 10th.

COVID Symptoms (not tested)

- ◆ Symptomatic but not test proving or disproving the presence of COVID-19 may return if:
 - ◆ No longer has a fever for 72 hours without the use of fever reducing medications &
 - ◆ Other symptoms have improved &
 - ◆ At least 10 calendar days have passed since symptoms first appeared
- ◆ Students or staff experiencing COVID symptoms at school will access a separate Isolation Space that will allow for evaluation and holding for potential pick-up. This space is separate from the regular Health Office.
